

# **COVER PHOTO'S**

### The Parthenon

The Parthenon, built for the 1897 Tennessee Centennial at Nashville, is the worlds only reproduction of the ancient temple at Athens, Greece. It contains casts of the Elgin Marbles, famous sculptures for the original Parthenon. Nashville is often called "The Athens of the South" as a direct reference to this beautiful landmark.

### The Hermitage

The Hermitage is the restored home of Andrew Jackson, the 7th President of the United States. This stately home was built in 1818 and rebuilt in 1835. Andrew Jackson and his wife are buried on the grounds. The home and grounds are open to visitors throughout the year.

### The Nashville Skyline

The Nashville Skyline shows the cooperation of classic with contemporary which creates the true atmosphere of Nashville. The Cumberland River winds its way through the heart of the city and backfalls the classic Capitol Building as well as the contemporary highrises which house the national headquarters of several major insurance firms. # **OBJECTIVES OF THE AIO**

To advance the science and practice of organbuilding by discussion, inquiry, research, experiment and other means; and to disseminate knowledge regarding pipe organbuilding by such means as lectures, publications and exchange of information. To establish an organized training program for organbuilders, leading to examinations and certifications of degree of proficiency.

# **MEMBERSHIPS**

### REGULAR

a. Individuals who have not less than 5 years professional experience in organbuilding, and who subscribe to the objectives of the institute, may be nominated for regular membership by a charter or regular member of the AIO, utilizing current approved membership application form. References to at least two additional persons, who are regular or charter members of the Institute, is also normally required. Nominees become regular members upon acceptance by the Board and payment of joining fee and 1st years dues.

### ASSOCIATE

b. Individuals who are professionally engaged in organbuilding, and who subscribe to the objectives of the Institute, may be nominated for associate membership by a charter or regular member of the AIO, utilizing current approved membership application form. Nominees become associate members upon acceptance by the Board and payment of joining fees and 1st years dues. Associate members shall not vote. Associate members may apply for regular membership upon completion of at least 5 years professional experience in organbuilding. Additional joining fee is not required.

# **FEES AND DUES**

The annual dues are \$40.00, payable in the last quarter of each year, in advance of January 1 of the following year. In addition, a one time joining fee of \$50.00 is required of all successful applicants.

The sum of \$25.00 must accompany any nomination for membership. When the nominee is approved for membership, that deposit will be credited to the joining fee. Should the nominee not be so approved, the \$25.00 will be returned.







TIME: The Convention begins on Sunday, October 4, 1987 and runs through Wednesday evening, October 7, 1987.

Jan Rowland

A charter member of the AIO, Jan Rowland started off with every intent of becoming an electrical engineer. However, while still in college, he was drafted during the Viet-Nam fracas, but sent to Germany. Prior to that he had done occasional installation work for Wicks. After discharge from the army in Munchen, he worked for a time for the German firm of Walcker & Cie. After a couple of installations in the U.S. for Walcker, he returned to Germany to marry "Hanne." Following that, he took a position with the Berkshire Organ Company and on leaving that organization, co-founded the firm of Visser-Rowland. Over the years, he has written articles for several publications, including ISO 'Information' and is now the Member of the Editorial Board for the Americas for that periodical. He is now "retired" acting as what he calls (for lack of a more formal title), "Consulting Inventor," in which capacity he has built several computer controlled machines for organbuilders in the U.S. and abroad.

His work on leather deterioration was accomplished in his spare time and was not related to his work at the Institute.

After completing his M.S. degree in 1967, he worked as a Research Health Physicist at the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission "National Reactor Testing Station", Idaho Falls, Idaho. He was next commissioned as an officer in the U.S. Air Force and was assigned as Chief of the Radiation Measurements Division of the U.S. Air Force Radiological Health Laboratory, Wright Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, where he served for 8 years.

He next transferred his commission to the U.S. Public Health Service Commissioned Corps and was assigned as Chief of the Instrumentation and Health Physics section of the Food and Drug Administration Nuclear Medicine Research Laboratory at the University of Cincinnati, where he served for 8 years, until his present position.
